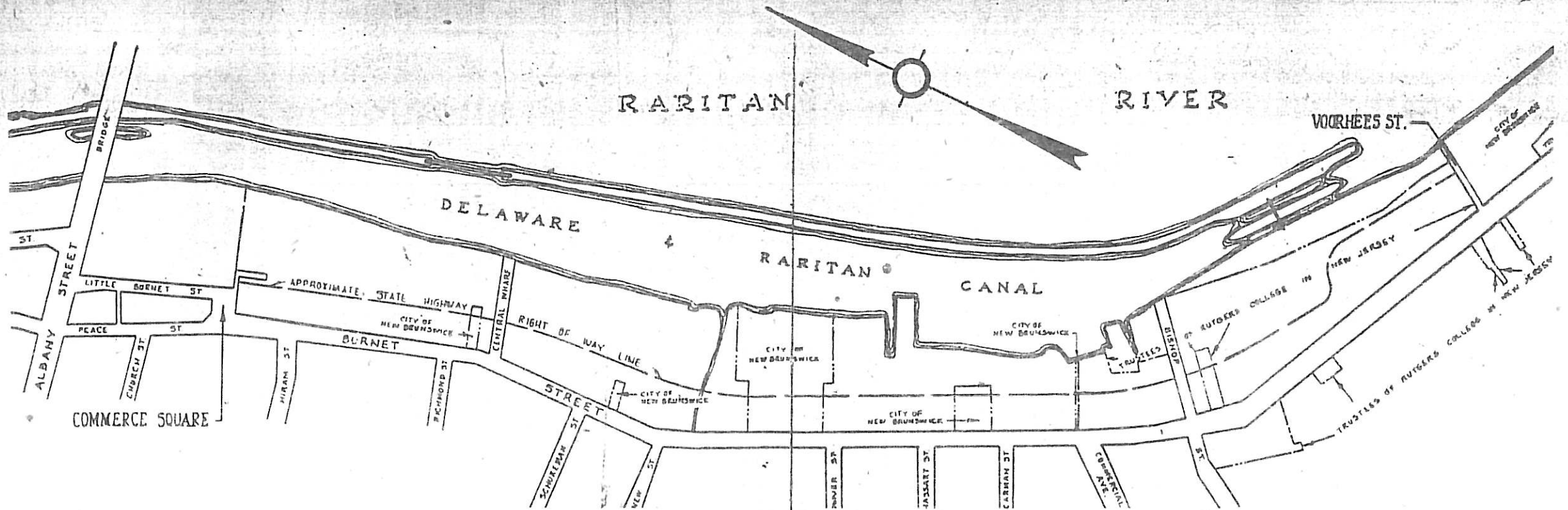


How City and State Will Cooperate on Burnet Street Parkway



How Burnet street in New Brunswick will be widened to form a riverfront parkway is shown on map above, prepared by State Highway Department. City and state are cooperating on history-making project in which property needed for parkway will be acquired jointly. Right of way averaging 100 feet wide will be purchased from Voorhees street to Commerce square, as shown on map, with heavy dash line marking eastern boundry. City will pay \$300,000 and state the remainder in buying the necessary land from present owners. When completed, the parkway will extend to the westerly line of Burnet street and will average about \$150 feet in width.

State and City Are Cooperating To Build Burnet Street Parkway

Two Government Units to Join in Buying Necessary Land for Highway Through City; New Brunswick to Provide \$300,000 for Land

Widespread interest throughout the State of New Jersey is reported in the plan under which the state is cooperating with the City of New Brunswick in construction of the Burnet street parkway, which is the first arrangement of this kind in state history.

state will acquire sufficient land to widen Burnet street sufficiently to construct a parkway running parallel with the Raritan river. Acquisition of the necessary property is now being planned and will probably be undertaken shortly.
