

Strikers May Build Rival Factory.

NEW BRUNSWICK, N. J., July 5.—The forty-eight members of the Color Mixers and Machine Printers' Union, who are striking from the wallpaper factories of Janeway & Carpenter and Janeway & Co. for recognition of their organization, have decided to form an independent company on the co-operative plan. The present companies have refused to recognize the men as a body, and have put other men to work in their places. Each of the strikers is to raise \$1,000, making \$48,000 in all, and a union factory will be built, the strikers say, to compete with the Janeway factories.
