New Reservation at Stelton,
N. J., Will Honor Soldier-
Poet of Last War

PLANS FOR SITE WITHHELD

But 2 Rutgers Students Make
Tour of Construction Area
Without Interference

WASHINGTON, Feb. 24—The name of Joyce Kilmer, who was killed July 30, 1918, in France while serving as a sergeant in the American Expeditionary Force, has been given to an Army camp to be established in New Jersey.

Camp Kilmer will be located at Stelton, near New Brunswick, where the poet was born Dec. 6, 1886. No details of the plans were disclosed.

Mr. Kilmer was a member of THE NEW YORK TIMES staff when he entered military service.
