

When Rev. H. F. Smith was pastor, from April 1869-1882, Mr. A. Van Winkle gave a lot on Remsen Ave. to build a Baptist Lecture-room, which became Remsen Ave. Baptist Church. Afterwards that congregation secured a lot on Livingston Ave. and erected a large fine edifice, now Livingston Ave. Baptist Church, one of the leading churches of the city.

The enterprising First Baptist Church built a substantial brick church for its negro members in 1876, Ebenezer Baptist Church, which has flourished.
