

By the 1930 census, first and second generation Hungarians in New Brunswick numbered 15,000. By now the figures are considerably higher, as the events in Europe in the 1940's and 1950's persuaded many Hungarians to flee from a homeland where everything was being taken from them. This last surge of immigration is within the memory of most of us since nearby Camp Kilmer provided a point of transfer for many people directly into the New Brunswick area. The largest concentration of Hungarians anywhere other than in Hungary is in the New Brunswick area.
