Phillip S. Johnson of New Brunswick (standing), was a member of the West Point Preparatory Class at Fort Benning, May, 1946.



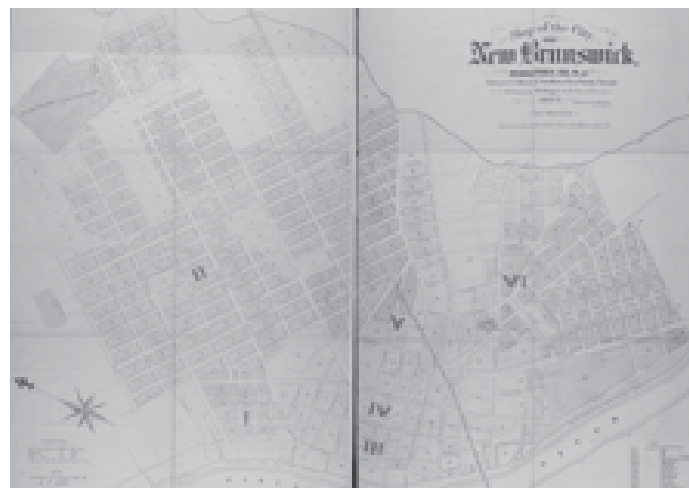

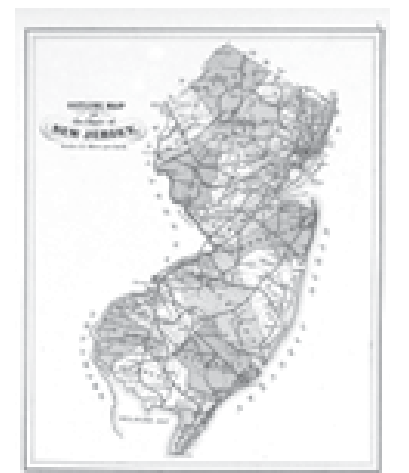

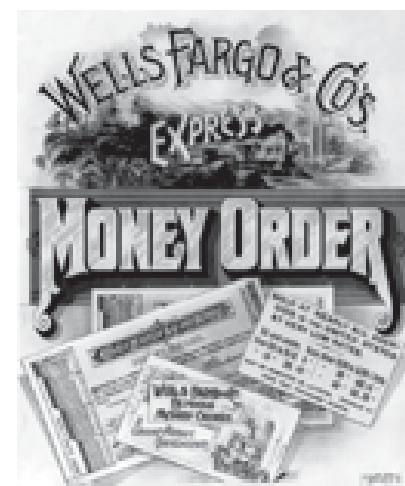

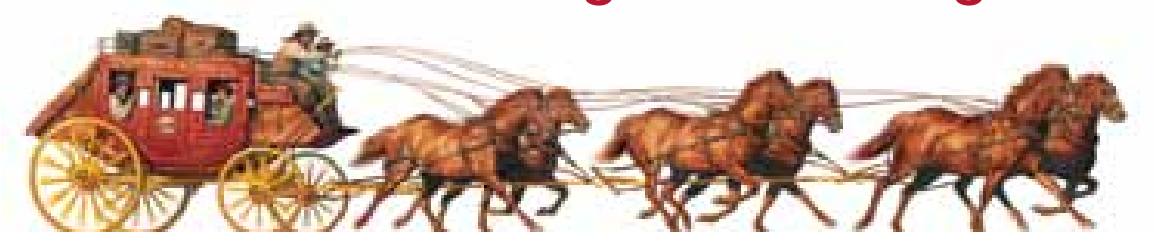
