MOURNED BY MANY.

The Death of Edward T. Latham - Removes a Notable Figure.

Edward T. Latham, whose death was announced in the TIMES yesterday, and which occurred at the residence of his mother, Mrs. Kate C. Latham, at Llangollen, Livingston avenue, on Saturday night, was prominent in banking and financial circles in New York city.

His death, which was sudden and entirely unexpected, was caused by hemorrhage of the lungs.

The deceased was born in Virginia and was the son of the late Robert W. Latham, who was a prominent banker in Washington during the fifties.

Edward T. Latham was a familiar figure in New York, where he was cashier of the banking house of Messrs. John Munroe & Company.

He had long been a great sufferer, but with undaunted courage he had held his post and fought the advance of disease ever hoping to resume his business duties. Lately he had been at a sanitarium for treatment. He was not married. He was widely known for his benefactions as well as a patron of art and literature. He had a peculiarly magnetic nature which attracted all classes and all ages whom he held by his unselfish interest, aid and counsel. He will be mourned by many who will miss his genial fellowship.
