

FUNERAL OF E. T. LATHAM.

Many Friends Attend the Obsequies Today.

The funeral services of Edward T. Latham took place from his late residence at Langollen, Livingston avenue at 2.30 p. m., today. The spacious rooms were filled with the many friends of the deceased from New York and this city, including men prominent in financial and professional matters, as well as others well known in literature and art circles.

The services were conducted by Rev. Alan D. Campbell, pastor of the Suydam Street Reformed Church, who was assisted by Rev. J. E. Adams, of Brooklyn, and formerly pastor of St. James M. E. Church.
