WILLIAM H. LUPTON FOUND DEAD IN BED

Had Been Mrs. Latham's Coachman
for a Number of Years.

William H. Lupton, an aged colored man, who had been coachman in the family of Mrs. Latham, of Livingston avenue, for many years, was found dead in bed this morning. He had not complained of ill health, and retired at the usual time last night. He slept in an upper room in the Latham house. This morning he failed to report at the usual time and a maid went to waken him. She found him dead in his bed. She notified Mrs. Robins, daughter of Mrs. Latham.

Dr. Donohue was sent for immediately. He gave it as his opinion that death had occurred several hours before. Death was due to heart failure.

Coroner Quackenboss was summoned and gave a permit for the removal of the body. It was taken to his home on Handy street. He leaves a widow and several sons.

The dead man was a faithful, honest man, much esteemed and respected by all who knew him.

Undertakers Herbert & Moke will have charge of the funeral, arrangements which have not yet been completed.
